

We live in a world where few people are equipped to protect themselves or their children from the unprecedented potential exposure to toxic substances that exists today. We are exposed to over 15,000 synthetic chemicals, most of which did not exist 50 years ago. These chemicals are dispersed widely in the environment and are found in the air, the water, and the soil. They are generated by industry, contained in the products we surround ourselves with, and occur in unexpected and unpredictable combinations with one another. Over half of them have never been tested for their potential toxicity.

Seattle author and educator **Jackie Alan Giuliano, Ph.D.**, in his new book, *Healing Our World, A Journey from the Darkness into the Light*, says individuals must invest the time and energy to improve their awareness of these realities. But he believes that the desire to become aware of the vast impact our human activities are having on our world can only come from developing a connection with the Earth, and from a deep appreciation of the complex web of life of which we are all a part. Reducing our separation from the natural world can also provide the energy to sustain the personal changes necessary to lessen our profound impact.
